

Services for Housing Insecurity

Connect Your Clients to Community Care Solutions | Free to Eligible Medi-Cal Members

If you or your family are experiencing housing insecurity, you may qualify for free Medi-Cal covered services through CalAIM. These Community Supports are designed to help you find stable housing, move in with confidence, and stay housed long-term.

Who is eligible: You may qualify if you are:

- Currently experiencing homelessness
- At risk of losing your housing
- A Medi-Cal managed care member

How to get connected:

- Ask your doctor, case manager, or social worker for a referral
- Self-refer by contacting your Medi-Cal managed care plan
- Referrals accepted from pediatricians, schools, 211 & more

Available Community Supports

Housing Transition Navigation Services

Help finding housing options, applying for housing benefits, landlord engagement, move-in support, and building your housing crisis plan.

Housing Deposits

One-time funding to cover move-in costs including security deposits, utility setup fees, and basic furniture. Does not include ongoing rental assistance.

Must have identified housing with a plan for rent

Housing Tenancy & Sustaining Services

Ongoing support to prevent eviction — landlord mediation, tenant rights education, independent living skills, and crisis planning.

Day Habilitation

Structured daytime services building daily living skills, community participation, and connection to community resources.

Transitional Rent

Up to 6 months of rental assistance for new housing for members who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness and meet clinical risk factors. Does not cover eviction prevention for current units. In early implementation.

Must have identified housing with a plan for rent

Additional care Coordination Help

Members accessing housing supports may also qualify for these CalAIM services to help coordinate all your care and needs in one place:



Enhanced Care Management (ECM)

ECM provides whole-person, high-touch coordination across medical, behavioral health, and social services.



Community Health Worker (CHW)

CHWs are trusted community members who can help you navigate the system and connect to resources.
